Where the Day Actually Goes.

THE NUMBERS ARE UNCOMFORTABLE

Knowledge workers spend 60% of their time on 'work about work' — chasing status, attending unnecessary meetings, and doing tasks that machines can now handle. The talent organisations hired for judgment is buried under coordination.



What consumes the day

- ✗ **51% on low or no-value tasks**
More than half the workday spent on activities that add nothing to output, decisions, or strategy.
- ✗ **352 hours a year talking about work**
Discussing, updating, re-explaining — instead of actually doing the work that matters.

What gets squeezed out

- ✓ **Deep thinking and judgment**
The decisions, trade-offs, and strategic calls that only humans can make are constantly deprioritised.
- ✓ **Creative and contextual work**
Taste, instinct, and nuanced understanding — the irreplaceable human contribution — get less than 3 hours a day.

THE REAL COST

Organisations aren't short on talent. They're short on time for talent to actually think.

What AI Takes, What Remains.

NOT REPLACEMENT – CLARIFICATION

AI doesn't threaten the core of knowledge work. It threatens the filler around it. The tasks being automated are precisely the ones that drain energy, cause disengagement, and prevent people from doing their best work.



The Three Layers AI Is Removing

01

Repetitive execution

Data entry, formatting, report generation, status updates — tasks that follow rules. AI handles volume without fatigue, error, or resentment.

02

First-draft production

Emails, summaries, briefs, proposals — AI produces the starting point. Humans refine, judge, and decide what actually gets sent.

03

Coordination overhead

Scheduling, follow-ups, meeting notes, information retrieval — the administrative layer that consumed hours now takes seconds.

WHAT THIS REVEALS

When the scaffolding is removed, what's left is the actual job: judgment, taste, and context.

The Irreplaceable Human Layer.



Three capabilities AI cannot replicate — and that become more valuable as everything else is automated.

IMPLICATION 01

Judgment under uncertainty

Decisions without complete information, trade-offs with no right answer, accountability for outcomes. These require a human who understands context, stakes, and consequence.

IMPLICATION 02

Taste and discernment

Knowing what's good, what fits, what will land. Aesthetic and strategic sensibility is deeply human — AI produces output, but humans decide what's worth keeping.

IMPLICATION 03

Contextual understanding

Reading the room, understanding history, sensing what's unspoken. Organisational intelligence — who matters, what's sensitive, why it works — remains irreducibly human.

This Is Not a Threat.



The organisations that struggle with AI are the ones treating it as a cost-cutting tool layered on top of broken workflows. The ones that win are redesigning work around it – removing the busywork, protecting the judgment, and giving people back the hours to do what they were actually hired for.
